cies, including curlews and sharp-tailed grouse," said Flinton. "As well, the burns will forage for wildlife and domestic cattle, and loading, which will help mitigate forest fire concerns in the future."

The overcast weather, mild winds and low humidity on Sunday met the requirements of the fire prescription, according to Flinton.
